Camilk 2024 Special Issue

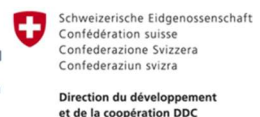
Selected contributions will be published in a Special Issue of the **Journal of Camelid Science** (ISSN:1999-8732, CiteScore 2022: 1.0).

The Camilk 2024 organizing committee is suggesting two optional field trips on October 5th for a minimum of 20 participants per tour:
